Lost Property

Student Safety

There have been a number of times over the past week when we have had to revisit one of our school rules

'To be in the right place at the right time doing the right thing.'

Student safety is very important to us. You can help to keep your children safe by

- Ensuring your children are not in the playground before 8:40am unless they are attending a supervised activity like band or dance. All students from Kindergarten to Year 6 who are in the playground before 8:40am are to sit on the silver seats outside the administration block. They are to remain on these seats until the teachers on morning duty collect them. Students are not to wait under the Hall Cola.
- Ensuring your children are collected from school at the correct time. There have been a number of occasions over the past week where staff are still waiting for students to be collected after 3:30pm. The only exception is students who go to BAC.

Can you volunteer? We need your help with the School Banking program!




Our students really enjoy participating in the Commonwealth Bank School Banking program and to keep this program running we need your help.
